A pre-election protest was filed pursuant to Article XIV, Section 2(b) of the *Rules for the* 1995-1996 IBT International Union Delegate and Officer Election ("Rules") by John Thomas, a member of Local Union 886. Mr Thomas alleged that Richard Nelson, president of Local Union 886, failed to give him a copy of the minutes from the 1996 IBT Convention based on Mr. Thomas' support of James P.
